Lakefront Enhancements

The visioning committee is eager to inject new vitality into Nashua by maximizing the untapped potential of Cedar Lake. The committee asked the design team to focus on the potential for two waterfront projects to help accomplish this. One is a restaurant/marina complex on the site of the veterans memorial at the north end of main Street, the other a condominium development along the shoreline of Cannon Park. The veterans memorial would then be relocated downtown on the vacant lot next to the post office. The nature and location of these projects would require them to be public/private partnerships between the city and a developer. The City owns the land. The developer would be responsible for building and managing the projects.

The visioning committee is seeking improvements to Main Street including repurposing the abandoned abutments and street right-of-way at the north end of downtown into a pedestrian bridge and corridor. This would create a convenient connection from downtown to the proposed restaurant/marina complex and east end of Cedar Lake. In addition, the design team has suggested ways to improve access to the river below the dam.
